School Officials Announce New Superintendent

Mr. Michael Kagan, Diocesan Superintendent of Schools, and Fr. Paul White, President of Marian Central's Council of Administration, have announced that Mr. Andreas Edmondson has been appointed by Bishop David Malloy to serve as Marian's superintendent beginning July 1, 2015. Mr. Edmondson replaces Mr. Thomas Landers who

has served in this capacity since 1983 and will be retiring as of June 30, 2015. For the past four years Mr. Edmonson has served as the Principal, Chief Administrative Officer, of Newman Central Catholic High School in Sterling, Illinois. Prior to his work at Newman Central Catholic, he served for four years as Assistant Principal at Challand Middle School and then Principal for three years of Lincoln Elementary School, both in Sterling. Mr. Edmondson received both his Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education and Secondary Social Studies as well as his Masters degree in Educational Leadership from Western Illinois University. He and his wife, Becki, also a Western Illinois University graduate and a kindergarten teacher in the Sterling School District, are the parents of two sons and a daughter. We welcome Mr. Edmondson and his family to Marian Central.

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Leo and Jean Cooney Estate Gíft

In December Marian Central was the recipient of an estate gift of \$250,000 from Leo and Jean Cooney of Woodstock. We are extremely grateful for this very generous gift from Mr. and Mrs. Cooney who have been supporters and benefactors of the school's many efforts since its inception in 1959. This gift will become a memorial scholarship endowment account in the Rockford Diocesan Foundation. The gift will be safeguarded throughout the life of the school with the earnings from the account avail-



able to be withdrawn for tuition assistance for Marian students. In fact, this is the second such gift Mr. and Mrs. Cooney have made to help families in their quest to have their children attend Marian Central. In 2002, Mr. and Mrs. Cooney set up their first endowed scholarship account in the Diocesan Foundation to provide Marian Central scholarships to students from families belonging to their home parish, St. Mary, Woodstock. Since that time, that endowment has provided tens of thousands of dollars of assistance to St. Mary parishioner families. The earnings from the new account will be made available to families whose students graduate from the Catholic elementary schools in McHenry County. At Marian Central we remember and pray daily for the repose of the souls of Mr. and Mrs. Cooney and all of our school's deceased benefactors as well as pray for our living benefactors.

End of Year Schedule, School Vacation Days & Early Dismissal

All students will be dismissed at 12:00 PM on Friday, May 1st – there is an afternoon teacher institute on that day and the junior/senior prom scheduled that evening. On Monday, May 25th, there will be no school and the office will be closed for Memorial Day. On Tuesday, May 26th, seniors will take semester exams for periods 1 & 2 and will be dismissed at 10:35 AM. On Wednesday, May 27th, seniors will take their semester exams for periods 3 through 7 with dismissal at 11:55 AM. On Thursday, May 28th, seniors will take their semester exams for periods 8 & 9 with dismissal at 10:35 AM. All freshmen, sophomores and juniors will have full days of classes on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, May 26th, 27th and 28th. All freshmen, sophomores and juniors will take their semester exams for periods 1 & 2 on Friday, May 29th with dismissal at 10:45 AM. They will take their semester exams for periods 3 through 7 on Monday, June 1st with dismissal at 12:05 PM; and will take their semester exams for periods 8 & 9 on Tuesday, June 2nd after which they will be dismissed for summer vacation at 10:45 AM. There are no excused absences for family vacations during the week of semester exams. Make your plans for the end of the school year in accordance with our schedule. Also, parents are advised that the school does not sanction, grant, or condone "skip" or "ditch" days of any kind. In the event a student would choose to do so, s/he is recorded as being truant and receives an unexcused absence for the day which results in an "F" grade for each class missed as well as being assigned a Saturday detention.

Tuition Payment Options for 2015-16

The June letter, which will be sent by snail mail to parents of students, will contain the tuition payment options as well as the Tuition Contract for the 2015-16 school year. Next school year we will continue to offer various payment options and incentives which many families took advantage of during the current year. Families who choose to prepay their entire tuition by July 15th will receive a 3% discount. All families who choose other payment options – semester, quarterly, or monthly – are to make their initial tuition down-payment by July 31st. Payments can be made by credit card, check or cash.

The school will provide two methods for making fees and tuition pre- or down-payments for the upcoming 2015-16 school year.

- 1. Payments can be made online through the school web site. Families who choose this option are also to fill out and submit the online school forms at the time of making payment.
- 2. Payments can be made in person at the school office. Families who choose to make these payments in person are to do so according to the following schedule:
 - Those families who wish to take advantage of the 3% discount are to come to the school on Tuesday or Wednesday, July 14th or 15th between the hours of 11:00 AM and 6:00 PM to make their tuition and fee payments.
 - Families who choose one of the other payment options are to come to the school on Wednesday, July 29th or Thursday, July 30th between the hours of 11:00 AM and 6:00 PM or on Friday July 31st between the hours of 10:00 AM and 1:00 PM to make their fee and one-half or one-quarter tuition down-payment.

Tuition-End of Year

Council of Administration policy states, "No student will be allowed to take second semester exams unless his/her tuition and any other fees are paid in full. There are no exceptions to this policy at the end of the second semester." Tuition statements were sent at the beginning of April to all families that still had tuition balances due. Statements will be sent again at the end of April to any family whose tuition is in arrears at that time. All financial obligations must be paid prior to the second semester exams scheduled to begin on May 26th for seniors and May 29th for freshmen, sophomores and juniors.

Tuition Assistance Program

Application forms for the 2015-16 tuition assistance program are still available. Families who wish to apply for assistance are to use the link on the front page of the school's web site, click on "Financial Assistance Applications", fill out the necessary forms and submit them online to Private School Aid Service. <u>The deadline for submitting application forms is May 1, 2015</u>, so time is short. For further information regarding the program, please contact the bookkeeper, Mrs. Peggy Murwin or Mr. Thomas Landers, Superintendent.

Based upon the feedback we have received, people were generally pleased with the organization and execution of the event as well as with the fact that it was a casual dress affair. Most of the net proceeds from the evening will be deposited in the school's tuition assistance fund to be drawn upon in 2015-16 by families who demonstrate need. A full report on how Development Department fundraising proceeds will be expended in 2015-16 will be included in the annual report that will be published and distributed in September.

Book Buy Back

The mid-May mailing that we will be sending to parents will contain, among other things, the following information: a) a listing of the books that the school will buy back at the end of the 2014-15 school year; and b) a list of the textbooks needed for each course in the 2015-16 school year to be used in making textbook purchases. Book buy back will take place at the time of semester exams. Students who desire to sell textbooks back to the school must turn them in to their classroom teachers when they



take their final exams. Seniors are to put their names on an ENVELOPE and place it inside the book front cover when it is turned in on the day of the final exam. Seniors will have the envelopes returned with the money for the texts when they receive their diplomas following the graduation ceremony. Freshmen, sophomores, and juniors are to put their names on the 3 x 5 form which will be provided by the school and place it inside the book front cover when it is turned in on final exam day. The money for books sold back by freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will be applied as a <u>tuition credit for the 2015-16</u> school year. At the end of June, the bookkeeper will mail statements to all families of students who sell books back to the school indicating the amount of credit which will be applied toward the 2015-16 tuition.

Used and New Textbook Purchases for 2015-16

The procedures that will be used by parents for the purchase of used and new textbooks for 2015-16 are as follows. Regarding the purchase of used texts from the school – the school will be selling the used books it purchases back from the students at the end of the year. We will conduct our used book sales on Monday, June 8th, from 5:00 to 6:30 PM in the school cafeteria. Parents of incoming freshmen are welcome to begin purchasing any texts the school has available at 5:00 PM on that day; all other families will begin purchasing at 5:30 PM.

Regarding the purchase of new and other used texts – families can order new and other used textbooks online beginning July 1st from the school's official book store, Missouri Book Service (MBS). You can access this online bookstore from Marian's web site by clicking on "Student Life" and then from the left side menu click on "Bookstore". Textbooks will be sent directly from MBS to the parents. MBS will provide free shipping on orders placed between July 1st and 7th. Parents are encouraged to order these textbooks far enough in advance to be assured of their students receiving their textbooks in August prior to the beginning of the 2015-16 school year.

Important Information

Dennis Uniform Purchases for 2015-2016

The school uniform items for 2015-16 – sweaters, polo shirts, and slacks – will be the same as the current school year and will once again be purchased from Dennis Uniform Company, the school's only official school uniform provider. P.E. uniforms will also be purchased through Dennis Uniform Company. Representatives from the company will be at Marian in the main gymnasium to assist families with fittings on Monday, June 8th, from 4:00 to 8:00 PM. This is the same day that the sale of used textbooks will take place. The representatives will have a supply of uniform and P.E. items here at Marian that families can purchase and take home. Families of incoming freshmen as well as current families who may have a need to order replacement uniform items are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity so that students will be prepared for the beginning of the 2015-16 school year. Families can also order uniform and P.E. items from Dennis through Marian's web site by clicking on "Parents" and then from the left side menu click on "Uniforms".

2015-2016 Participating Parishioner Certification

Each school year families belonging to one of the seventeen Catholic parishes in McHenry County must have their pastor certify their participation at the parish in order to receive the lower tuition rate. As announced previously, 2015-16 tuition rates will be as follows: the Standard Tuition Rate will be \$8,375 per student; the Participating Parishioner Tuition Rate will be \$6,255 for the first student from a family; and the tuition rate for families belonging to a Rockford Diocesan Catholic parish outside McHenry County will be \$7,310 per student. The mid-May mailing which will be sent to families will include the "Request for Participating Parish Tuition Rate" form. Information regarding qualifications for receiving the Participating Parish Tuition Rate will also be included in that mailing. Initially, the school will charge all students the Standard Tuition Rate for 2015-16 will need to take this form to the Pastor of their McHenry Deanery or Rockford Diocesan Catholic parish for his or his designee's signature. This signed form is to be returned to our school bookkeeper by the family prior to or at the time of making the initial tuition pre- or down-payment. She will then adjust the family's tuition rate to the lower Participating Parishioner Rate.

Seniors

Graduation is almost upon us. It's hard to believe that your four years of high school are almost over. Congratulations to you seniors for all of your effort and hard work that will result in your graduation! Congratulations to the parents of our seniors for all of the encouragement and support that they have given their students!

Graduates, as you go forward in life after graduation, whether you will be continuing your education, joining the workforce, or entering the military, always believe in yourself and do the very best that you can. May God bless you always.

Shortly after May 1st all seniors will be requested to indicate their final college/university choice on a form from Guidance. This information is needed so that the final transcript will be mailed to the college you plan to attend. Every college requires the final transcript before the college articulation process begins in the fall. Seniors who do not plan to attend college will be requested to indicate their plans as well.

Once seniors have decided which school they will attend next fall, please be sure to notify those schools to which you have been accepted, but are not planning to attend, that you will not be coming to their school. A brief email or letter thanking them for their offer of admission but declining it will suffice. This will allow students who may be on waiting lists an opportunity for admission.

Scholarships

Scholarships will continue to be available in Guidance until the end of the school year. They are posted on the Guidance web page and on a bulletin board in the Guidance Office. Be sure to check with your intended college/university for any scholarships that they may offer. Sometimes departmental scholarships exist for incoming freshmen that are not well publicized.

Seniors are reminded to bring their scholarship offers to the Guidance Office, even if they do not plan to attend the school that offered it. We will make copies of them. The scholarship information is used for Honor's Day and other publications.

Juniors

The ACT test will be administered on April 18, 2015 here at Marian. The ACT results will be mailed to students' homes in a couple of weeks. Any junior who missed the April 18th test or who wishes to retake the ACT on June 13th can register online at *www.actstudent.org*. The deadline for registering for the June 13th test is May 8th. This test will not be administered at Marian Central. Registration for the first ACT test next year on September 12th will be available in July. The registration deadline for the September 12th test is August 7th. Students can register for all upcoming ACT tests online at the ACT web site: *www.actstudent.org*.

The next SAT test may be taken on June 6th. The deadline to register for that test is May 8th. Registration information is available in the Guidance Office. Students can register online at the College board web site: *www.sat.org/register*. Students are encouraged to take both the ACT and the SAT tests as the formats are different and some students may do better on one versus the other. Most colleges will accept either test score for admission.

Any junior and/or their parents are welcome to schedule an appointment with Mrs. Hilton or Mrs. Reed to assist them in their college selection process.

Juniors are reminded that there may still be some college representatives that will schedule visits during the month of April or May. Please check the board in the Guidance Office or the Guidance web page for dates and times.

Freshmen and Sophomores

The results of the ASPIRE tests that the freshmen and sophomores took last fall will be distributed to them this month. Please ask your student to share their results with you.

All students should be continuing to focus on their classes to maximize their opportunities later.
