

MARIAN CENTRAL CLASS OF 2020

Due to restrictions made by the Illinois Board of Education regarding school graduations this year, Marian Central had to pivot and re-evaluate how to celebrate the Class of 2020. Individual graduations were held in Landers' Pavilion over three days. Graduates were scheduled to come to Marian at a pre-arranged day and time in full graduation attire (cap, gown, and Marian-earned regalia). They were videotaped walking across the stage as their name was called, receiving their diploma, being acknowledged for any awards, moving their tassel, and throwing their cap. Four family members could accompany each graduate while maintaining appropriate social distancing. All components of a traditional graduation were upheld, including "Pomp and Circumstance", "The Star-Spangled Banner", and all speeches. Videos were distributed to all graduating families. As we prepared to begin this year, the Bible verse above kept coming to mind in prayer for me. That verse is the conclusion of the famous prologue to John's Gospel. It's a beautiful passage which reflects on the great mystery of the Incarnation. St. John is simply in awe of the fact that in Jesus, he saw the very face of God, and that this God loves him so much that he would die for him. Almost at a loss for words, he concludes with deep gratitude, "From His fullness we have all received, grace upon grace!"

The word grace refers to God's gift of Himself for our salvation. Christian prayer always begins with a spirit of gratitude, recognizing that, long before we have ever loved God, He has loved us first.

I want to encourage every one of us to never forget how good God has been to us. Are times tough? You betcha. But Jesus never promised the false hope of an easy life for His disciples. He said it clearly, "If anyone wishes to come after Me must deny himself, take up his cross daily, and follow Me," (Luke 9:23). And boy do we have a cross to bear right now. That's why we need to constantly remind ourselves: "In all things God works for the good of those who love Him," (Romans 8:28). That's why we need to know of God's grace in our bones. That's why, continuing that tradition started by Fr. Doyle many years ago, I've decided to make the spiritual theme for this year: Grace upon Grace!

God loves us, redeems us, and promises us eternal life with Him: grace upon grace! God has brought together this Marian Central Catholic High School community in person to start off this year: grace upon grace! From His fullness we have all received: grace upon grace!






FUND RAISING PROCEEDS

During the 2019-20 school year, the Advancement Office was responsible for administering and overseeing three fund raising efforts: Annual Fund Appeal, Athletic Benefit Golf Outing, and Dinner Auction.

These fundraising efforts generated the following net proceeds during the 2019-20 fiscal year:

Annual Fund – Unrestricted	\$63,507
Annual Fund – Restricted	\$10,074

Dinner Auction	\$19,564
Fine Arts	\$6,987
Golf Outing.....	\$12,993
Memorial Donations.....	\$1,275

The restricted gifts are deposited in accounts in accord with the donors' wishes at the time of the donation. The dinner auction was cancelled due to COVID-19 so the funds carry over to 2020-21. The golf outing was moved to July so the net proceeds from the golf outing are recorded as Development revenue in 2020-21 operations and expended on Athletic Department equipment and supplies. Memorial donations are either restricted for a particular purpose or deposited in the school's endowment fund. The total value of the school's endowment funds invested in the Diocesan Foundation as of June 30, 2020 amounted to \$2,115,268.



2020 DINNER AUCTION

The 20th Annual Dinner Auction was scheduled for April 18, 2020. Due to COVID-19, the event had to be cancelled so the funds will carry over to 2020-21. We greatly appreciate the support of these businesses and donors, who helped us raise \$19,564 for the tuition assistance program.


